Introduction

This information sheet is aimed at organisations and groups working in Wales who want to take a first step towards sustainable working practices and who want to find out more about climate change and how they can make a positive contribution towards tackling it.

Sources of help (listed alphabetically) Awel Aman Tawe

Awel Aman Tawe is a community energy project working to make a difference to the lives of people at the top of the Swansea and Amman Valleys. It aims to bring clean electricity, jobs and regeneration to the villages near the Mynydd y Gwrhyd. It has planning permission to build a two-turbine community wind farm high up on the Gwrhyd, a £6million asset that will bring low carbon energy and construction contracts to the area, together with an annual income stream from the sale of electricity of some £200,000 that will help to fund local projects.

It works to raise awareness of the importance of clean energy in the fight against the threat of climate change through a sustained programme of information, communication and consultation and, more recently, through an innovative range of arts activities related to climate change that often reach people at a deeper level.

Home Heat Helpline

The Little Book of Energy has been launched to provide people – particularly those most at risk of fuel poverty - with practical tips and advice that can help them cut their energy bills.

The Little Book of Energy is intended to make people more energy efficient around the home so that they use less and save more. And this can be achieved through simple steps such as making sure radiators are not blocked by furniture or covered by curtains and only boiling as much water as you need.

The book also highlights the range of support services available from the Home Heat Helpline which include:

- Advice on social tariffs – typically a 20 per cent saving
- The Priority Service Register which provides extra services for people who are elderly or disabled including bills in large text or Braille, security passwords and an annual gas safety check
- Grants for free home insulation
- Flexible payment options for customers in fuel debt
- Benefits entitlement checks

Helping all kinds of people cut carbon and fuel. They work in Welsh and English towns and valleys around Bishop's Castle, Knighton and Presteigne, Montgomery and Newtown. They train volunteers from these areas to make visits and gather data on your energy use. You can also choose to complete a data gathering form and submit it to them yourself. The Energy Team, led by a professional Energy Officer, then provides you with your free energy survey report giving you:

- Recommendations for energy saving measures you can take at home and on the move - including no cost / low cost energy saving tips
- Independent technical and grant advice on insulation, renewables, low impact transport etc.
- Signposting to other information sources. □ Ongoing support to take action.
